

How do I declare my major in Economics???

1. Fill out a Declaration of Major form and have it signed by any of the Economics advisors. The form can be acquired either from Scott Zacher (Andersen 303, 7-7263) or from the Office of Studies, 1922 Sheridan Road. A list of our advisors and their walk-in office hours can be found at <http://www.econ.northwestern.edu/undergraduate/advising.html> or in the bottom pocket of the magazine rack outside Scott Zacher's office. Be aware that this department does not assign you an advisor, which means you can go to any advisor at any time.
2. After the Declaration of Major form is signed by one of our advisors, bring the bottom blue copy to Scott Zacher (Andersen 303) and take the top copy to the WCAS Office of Studies, 1922 Sheridan Road.

You are also required to complete five courses in related areas, i.e., other social sciences (anthropology, history, political science, psychology, sociology) or mathematics and statistics. Two of these must be Math 220 and Statistics 210 or their equivalents. Any combination of three additional courses in the indicated departments is acceptable, *but no more than one course may be at the 100-level*. Courses offered to meet Weinberg College of Arts and Sciences distribution requirements may be counted as related courses, as may Economics 260: Accounting and Business Finance.
